Parking: St. Mary's Road will be fully closed from Weds 10 - Mon 15 June. Parking will be available on the hard standing at Annay Road rugby pitch, which is only a couple of minutes' walk away from Harmony (on the Melrose to Newstead road - follow the one way signs down Abbey Street). This is subject to weather conditions and strictly NO parking on the rugby oitch.

Additional parking may also be on offer at Melrose Primary School but please refer to our website for updates.

All parking in Melrose town centre is within easy reach of the festival venues.

There is a DROP OFF ONLY zone on Annay Road but please note there is no parking in this area and a on way system will be in operation.
